the Kerrville Daily Times In the Hill Country, Christmas morning 1914 was bleak. The sky was covered by slate colored clouds and a chill wind blew from the north. Over the whole world there was a pall cast by the trench warfare int which World War I had drifted. For our own family the prospect was also bleak as the wintry sky. That fall, Dad had resigned his pastorate and we had moved from Hondo to Tarpley, where he had accepted a call as pastor of the Baptist Church. mere on hall accepted a carried properties of the Baptist Church. We were living at the old Dial place. The house stood beside a dirty road that followed the banks of Williams Creek from Tarpley up to the Lucius Hicks Ranch. We had almost no money and could afford no extravagances such as decorations for the Christmas tree.
