All of us with children with All of us with children with special needs have had to become advocates for our chil-dren. Sometimes the problems seem impossible to solve. Sometimes progress is made in one area, only to regress in another.

Teachers certainly are not being adequately trained to deal with all the special needs children that they may meet in their classrooms.
